Street View features updates and information on district specific and citywide initiatives from the Street Transportation Department. This report covers the period from March 1 through April 25.

Council District 1 Initiatives

Traffic Signal Updates

Street Transportation installed a new traffic signal at the following location in D1. The new traffic signal includes flashing yellow arrows for all left-turn movements, vehicle video detection, audible pedestrian pushbuttons, new Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ramps, emergency vehicle preemption, improved streetlighting, and signal heads over all travel lanes.



1. 19th Ave. and Alameda Rd. – This is the 1,187th traffic signal installed in Phoenix.

Street Transportation is upgrading the traffic signals along 43rd Avenue from Bethany Home Road to Northern Avenue to add additional signal heads and flashing yellow left-turn arrows to improve the safety of the intersections. The project also includes crosswalk illumination and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ramp modifications. The upgraded signals are expected to be activated in spring 2024.

2. 43rd Ave., Bethany Home Rd. to Northern Ave.

Intersection Improvements

Street Transportation is improving the following intersection to include full traffic signal upgrades and raised median modifications to improve the negative offsets at left-turn lanes. The project is anticipated to be completed in summer 2024.

3. 43rd Ave. and Peoria Ave.

Roadway Repair Work

Street maintenance crews completed significant roadway repairs at the following locations in D1:

- 4. 4056 W. Charlotte Dr.
- 5. 59th Ave., Pinnacle Hill Dr. to Alameda Rd.



Drainage Maintenance

As part of routine maintenance, crews inspect for obstructions, clear vegetation, and make repairs to keep flow lines open. Crews performed maintenance, construction, or repair work at the following locations in D1:

- 6. 31st Ave. and Deer Valley Rd.
- 7. 16040 N. 28th Ave.

Citywide Update

Shared Micromobility Program

The Street Transportation Department is developing a strategy to expand the city's Shared Micromobilty Program. The department is considering options to expand the program boundaries and vehicle inventory. Community input is needed to help make decisions about how to improve the program. Upcoming Public Meetings

Vision Zero Community Advisory Committee

In September 2022, Phoenix City Council approved a comprehensive <u>Vision Zero Road Safety Action Plan</u> and the allocation of \$10 million in annual funding for its implementation. The City Council decision also approved formation of an 11-member <u>Vision Zero Community Advisory Committee</u>, which will provide feedback and recommendations about how the Plan is facilitated.

The members are appointed by the Mayor and City Council. The committee also includes non-voting members who are students from local high schools and colleges/universities.

The meetings will be held both in person and virtually. The meeting agenda, which includes instructions about how to participate virtually via Webex or by phone, will be posted on the Public Meeting Notices webpage approximately one week prior to the meeting date.
